## DAY 1: Nashville, TN - Grand Ole Opry (D)

Begin your journey by travelling to Nashville, TN for an overnight stay. Dinner this evening is included at the Backstage Grill Restaurant with Southern cooking paired perfectly with live country music. Following dinner, see a performance at the Grand Ole Opry. Each Opry show features an array of performances by new stars, superstars and legends of country music as well as great bluegrass, comedy and more. Opry shows are never rehearsed and never the same show twice.

## DAY 2: Dublin, GA - World of Coca-Cola Tour (B)

Stop in Atlanta at the World of Coca-Cola where the famous soft drink's story is told through fascinating exhibits, classic ads and a fanciful representation of the bottling process. Taste Coca-Cola products from around the world and pick your favorite before raiding the gift shop for souvenirs. Continue on to Dublin, GA for the night. Dinner is on your own this evening.



## DAY 3: Amelia Island

### Historic Trolley Tour of Savannah, Lunch at The Olde Pink House (B,L,D)

This morning, enjoy a narrated trolley tour of Savannah, GA. Hop aboard the trolley and a friendly conductor will narrate the tour with a fascinating and fun mix of trivia and humorous stories. The extraordinary architecture, lush botanicals, and captivating stories of this historic, coastal city make for an unforgettable experience. Lunch is included today at The Olde Pink House, Savannah's stately Georgian Mansion facing Reynolds Square, listed as a National Landmark.

## DAY 4: Amelia Island, Fernandina Beach, Kingsley Plantation (B)

Start the day with a guided tour of Amelia Island. With 13 miles of beautiful beaches, abundant native wildlife, and pristine waters, this barrier island has long been a beloved destination for visitors and residents alike. Enjoy a tour through the historic downtown covering the history of the buildings, homes and a historical exploration (it was controlled by France, Spain and England) of the area.

This afternoon you will have time to explore Fernandina Beach. Downtown Fernandina Beach offers boutique shopping and a range of scrumptious restaurants. Then head to Jacksonville to tour the Kingsley Plantation, located on Fort George Island. Anna Kingsley was the first black woman in Florida







to own three plantations and her own slaves. This is a must-hear story. You can explore the grounds at Kingsley Plantation, which includes the slave quarters barn, waterfront, plantation house, kitchen house and an interpretive garden. Returning to Amelia Island, dinner is on your own this evening. Explore the town, there are many wonderful shops and restaurants.

#### **DAY 5: St. Augustine, Black Raven Pirate Ship Cruise, Fountain of Youth Dinner & Show (B,D)**

This morning, head to St. Augustine, the nation's oldest city, and also one of the nation's most charming. Meet a local guide for a city tour. Discover more than four centuries of history that owes much to the Spanish and English, to Greeks and Native Americans and African Americans. Afterwards, you have free time for lunch on your own and shopping in the historic district.

The next adventure takes us to the Black Raven Pirate Ship, a one-of-a-kind live pirate show full of music, thrills and pure entertainment. Participate in our adventure, sing along with our crew and find your inner pirate while you see the beautiful sights of the Matanzas River.

Then visit Ponce de Leon's Fountain of Youth (ca. 1513). You will discover it is an archaeological park and learn of that first encounter in 1513 between the Spanish and the Indians. Your tour guide will also show you the original spring, and have a chance to drink from it just as thousands have before you.

Tonight, you will enjoy a dinner and show at the Raintree Restaurant, a restored St. Augustine 1879 Colonial Victorian Home. Following dinner, you enjoy the "The Lives and Wives of Henry Flagler". Hear the story of empire builder Henry Morrison Flagler. His tremendous accomplishments during the glorious Gilded Age are seen through the eyes of his three captivating wives. As each tells her own story, the true Henry Flagler comes alive.





### **DAY 6: Jacksonville, St. Johns River**

After breakfast, travel to Jacksonville where you meet a local guide for a city tour. The “River City by the Sea” boasts more than 20 miles of wide and uncrowded beaches, close to 40 miles of the tranquil Intracoastal Waterway Canal, and the longest stretch of the beautiful St. Johns River. All the natural beauty is surrounded by a modern and vibrant city filled with authentic dining options, thrilling attractions and world-class museums.

This afternoon, you will take a St. Johns River Cruise. Enjoy a narrated cruise of local and river history along with illustrated accounts of the numerous bird species, alligators and other wild critters that call this area home. Frequent stops are made for photographs, intimate encounters and a thorough look at this most-fragile ecosystem. Once you return to Amelia Island, dinner is included at a local seafood restaurant.

### **DAY 7: Jekyll Island, Savannah, Mercer Williams House Museum, Lady & Sons, Dublin, GA (B,D)**

Today, you enjoy a guided tram tour of Jekyll Island. In 1886, 53 prominent American tycoons founded the Jekyll Island Club, and members created an exclusive gilded era island retreat on Georgia’s coast for their family and friends. Step into their past and experience the legends first-hand with the history of the area. This one-hour tram tour takes you through the 240-acre National Historic Landmark District, and includes entry into a restored cottage, the Mosaic Museum and Faith Chapel on your own.

Then head to Savannah, GA and enjoy a visit to the Mercer Williams House Museum, designed by New York architect John S. Norris for General Hugh W. Mercer, great-grandfather of songwriter Johnny Mercer. Construction of the house began in 1860, was interrupted by the Civil War, and was later completed around 1868 by the new owner, John Wilder. The house and carriage house are both constructed with deep rose-colored bricks called Philadelphia Reds.

Enjoy dinner at Lady & Sons. You may call the cooking Southern, Georgia Coastal or even Plantation Country Cuisine, but we just call it a good, home-cooked meal in an environment of true Southern Hospitality. Paula Deen started this place in 1989 with \$200, the help of her sons and a 1910 structure. Today, she runs one of Savannah’s most-celebrated restaurants.

End the day in Dublin, GA and check into your hotel for an overnight stay.

### **DAY 8: Nashville, TN (B)**

Travel to Nashville, TN for an overnight stay. Enjoy a free evening to explore with dinner on your own.

### **DAY 9: Depart for Home (B)**

After breakfast at the hotel, depart for home.
